ABOUT ROSARY COLLEGE

Rosary College of Commerce and Arts was established by the Archdiocese of Goa and Daman in June 1990. The College owes its inception to the magnanimous initiative of late Rev. Can. Jose Roberto Vaz, who was then the Parish Priest of Our Lady of Rosary Church. The College is managed by the Diocesan Society of Education and is a minority institution under Article 30(1) of the Indian Constitution.

Rosary College has been built by the Fabrica de Nossa Senhora do Rosario, Navelim, almost entirely from the proceeds of the sale of properties belonging to the Fabrica, Confraria de Nossa Senhora do Rosario and Confraria do Santissimo Sacramento.

The College has made strident progress in the last 34 years with a new, fully independent and self-sufficient block constructed due to the initiative of the former Principal Rev. Prof. Simão R. Diniz. It was built on account of a gamut of new courses introduced to keep pace with the burgeoning requirements of the industry. Further, in June 2023 another new block is added to run the self-finance courses.

Rosary College of Commerce and Arts has made quantum leaps in progress whether it was the recent re-accreditation- 4th cycle resulting in an A-grade with a CGPA score of 3.21 on a 4-point scale by NAAC, the quality of education imparted, the professional success of its alumni or the fact that Rosary College has upheld the Goa University Sports Championship for five times over the last decade. UPSC & GPSC Coaching Classes

The Civil Services Cell of Rosary College in Association with Abhyankar's I.A.S., Pune organizes UPSC & GPSC coaching classes for the students from South Goa.

The Highlights are:

- The coaching classes will Commence in the month of July, 2024.
- There will be a total of 35 sessions of 2 hours each, 75% of the sessions will be conducted online via an Integrated Management Software and the remaining 25% of the sessions will be conducted in offline mode in Rosary College.
- The Syllabus, contents and curriculum will be revised on a yearly basis to incorporate current affairs related information.
- The Teaching methodology includes case studies, current affairs discussions, and peer reviews.
- The batch size will be of maximum 40 students.
- The coaching classes are open to students from any college in Goa as well as other aspirants interested in Civil Services.

NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2020 (NEP – 2020)

The Goa University has implemented the National Education Policy 2020 from the Academic Year June 2023-2024 across all undergraduate programmes in the State of Goa. Accordingly, the duration of all the undergraduate programmes offered by the Goa University will be for 4 years with multiple entry & exist options and re-entry options with appropriate certification:

- a) UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study.
- b) UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study.
- c) Bachelor's degree after 3 years (6 semesters) of study.
- d) 4 year Bachelor's degree (Honours) after 8 semesters programme of study. If the student completes a rigorous research project in their major area(s) of study in the 4th year then the student will be awarded a Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research).

The Broad disciplines of study for Major & Minor courses as per the Goa University structure of 4 year undergraduate programmes based on the National Education Policy 2020 are as follows.

a) Natural and Physical Sciences:

Students can choose courses from Natural and Physical Sciences such as Microbiology, Botany, Zoology, Biotechnology, Biochemistry, Chemistry, Physics, Biophysics, Astronomy and Astrophysics, Earth and Environmental Sciences and such others.

b) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications:

Courses under this category will facilitate the students to use and apply tools and techniques in their major and minor disciplines. The courses may include training in programming software like Python among others and applications software like STATA, SPSS, Tally, etc.

c) Library, Information, and Media Sciences:

Courses from this category will help the students to understand the recent developments in information and media science (Journalism, Mass Media, and Communication)

d) Commerce and Management:

Courses include Business Management, Accountancy, Finance, Financial Institutions, Fintech, and such others.

e) Humanities and Social Sciences:

The courses relating to Social Sciences, for example, Anthropology, Communications and Media, Economics, History, Linguistics, Political Science, Psychology, Social Work, Sociology, etc., will enable students to understand the individuals and their Social Behaviour, Society, and Nation. Students will be introduced to survey methodology and the available large-scale databases for India. The courses under humanities include, for example, Archaeology, History, Comparative Literature, Arts & Creative expressions, Creative Writing and Literature, language(s), Philosophy, etc., and Interdisciplinary courses relating to humanities.

COURSE STRUCTURE UNDER NEP 2020

(a) Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary major (core)

It will give opportunity for a student to pursue in-depth study of a particular subject or discipline. The course will include only theory component or only practical component or theory and practical components. For courses with theory and practical components, the ratio of 75% Theory and 25% practicals shall be maintained with separate heads of passing.

(b) Disciplinary/interdisciplinary minors

Students will have the option to choose courses from Disciplinary / Interdisciplinary minors and skill-based courses relating to a chosen vocational education programme. Students who take the requisite number of courses (12 credits) in a discipline or an interdisciplinary area of study other than the chosen major will qualify for a minor in that discipline or in the chosen interdisciplinary area of study. A student shall declare the minor and vocational stream at the end of the second semester.

(c) Vocational Education and Training.

A minimum of 12 credits will be allotted under the 'Minor' stream to Vocational Education and Training related to the major or minor discipline or choice of the student.

(d) Multidisciplinary Courses

All UG students are required to undergo three introductory-level courses relating to any of the broad disciplines given below:

Natural and Physical Sciences; Mathematics, Statistics and Computer Applications; Library, Information and Media Sciences, Commerce and Management, Humanities and Social Sciences. Students should choose multidisciplinary courses not studied in the higher secondary level (11th & 12th class)

(e) Value-Added Courses (VAC) Common to All UG Students.

VAC common to all UG students include Understanding India, Environmental Science/Education, Digital and Technological solutions, Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, Fitness and other value added courses like National Service Scheme (NSS), National Cadet Corps (NCC) and such other courses.

(f) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

Students are required to achieve competency in a Modern Indian Language (MIL) and the English language with special emphasis on language and communication skills.

(g) Skills Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills and other courses to enhance the employability of students.

(h) Summer Internship /Apprenticeship

All students will also undergo internships / Apprenticeships in a firm, Industry or organisation or Training in Lab with faculty and researchers in their own or other HEIs/research institutions during the summer term.

(i) Community Engagement and Service

To expose students to the socio-economic issues in society so that the theoretical learnings can be supplemented by actual life experiences to generate solutions to real life problems. This can be a part of summer term activity or a part of major or minor course, depending upon the major discipline.

(j) Field-Based Learning/Minor Project

The field-based learning/minor project will attempt to provide opportunities for students to understand the different socio-economic contexts. This may be a summer term project or part of a major or minor course, depending upon the subject of study.

(k) Research Project / Dissertation

Students choosing a 4-Year Bachelor's degree (Honors with Research) are required to take up research projects under the guidance of a faculty member.

(l) Extra-Curricular Activities

National Service Scheme (NSS), National Cadet Corps (NCC), Adult Education/Literacy initiatives, mentoring school students and other similar activities.

The University shall consider designing an appropriate teaching- learning framework to bring it into the curriculum under VAC.

BACHELOR OF COMMERCE (HONORS)

The Bachelor of Commerce Programme is designed to equip students with an in-depth understanding and a working knowledge of the various disciplines of Commerce, Accounting and Finance, Banking as well as Management studies. The programme encompasses core courses of Commerce like Accounting, Costing, Banking and Business Management. To strike a balance between these are Multidisciplinary Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses, and Value Education Courses.

The Bachelor of Commerce Programme equips the students with the knowledge and skills needed for success in the global business world. Our students have access throughout the year to the well-stocked, well-equipped, and computerized library with computer networks and subscriptions to e-journals, e-books, e-newspaper, and plagiarism software.

The Department conducts field trips, excursions, quizzes, and other extra-curricular activities and organizes a national level event 'Insignia' which contributes to the complete, all round development of its students.

From the academic year 2023-24, as per the guidelines of the Goa University and the Directorate of Higher Education, the College has introduced Curriculum as per the NEP 2020 structure. The NEP 2020 Curriculum allows students to pursue graduation with single or Double major subjects. During the academic year 2024-25, the NEP 2020 curriculum is introduced at the second year level. However, at the third year level the choice based Credit System (CBCS) will be followed during 2024-25.

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

As per the NEP structure the BBA program with Honours spans over four years with 8 semesters covering a total of 160 credits. The NEP structure has been implemented in the state of Goa from June 2023; however, the Third-Year students will follow the Choice Based Credit System which spans over 11 terms covering a total of 140 credits. Both the systems are affiliated to Goa University.

The program's curriculum is crafted to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the different management domains involved in incorporating and efficiently managing a business. It also offers them the chance to specialize in a specific area of management, equipping them with the necessary expertise to pursue entry-level managerial roles. BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (TRAVEL & TOURISM)

With an objective of building competencies in students to effectively undertake entry level managerial jobs in travel and tourism related organizations, the college offers four years Honors Programme in Bachelor of Business Administration (Travel & Tourism) affiliated to Goa University. The Programme has been designed to prepare students to cope with the growing demands of travel and tourism industry as per the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

The BBA(T&T) Programme spans over 4 years with 8 Semesters, covering 160 credits with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options. Each Semester will comprise of 20 credits with subject specific major and minor courses, multi-disciplinary courses, ability enhancement courses, skills enhancement courses and value-added courses. After successfully completing the programme the students will acquire and demonstrate problem- solving skills, critical thinking skills, communication skills and leadership skills. On-the-Job training in the form of Internships in travel, tourism and hospitality organizations is an integral part of the programme.

The programme adopts blended learning approach to develop managerial acumen in the students. The students will be evaluated based on continuous assessment, in which Intra-Semester Assessment (ISA) and the Semester End Assessment (SEA) will contribute to the Final Grade. The students will develop ability to apply the knowledge gained in the classroom to real-life situations in the industry through field-based assignments, field trips, seminars and case study discussions.

Candidates who have passed Higher Secondary School Certification Examination are eligible to join First Year BBA (T&T). As per the Ordinance of Goa University, the intake capacity for the course is limited to 40 seats.

MASTER OF COMMERCE

The Master of Commerce Programme draws on the strengths of the disciplines of Accounting and Finance as well as Business Management to provide students with advanced skills and knowledge to be competent for positions in the private and public sector depending on the specialization they choose. The program makes use of students' prior knowledge & skills and paves the path for them to achieve their academic objectives.

The programme is designed to offer specialized education through student-centric teaching methodologies. Students are encouraged to participate in classroom learning via PowerPoint Presentations, Debates, Role Plays and Case Studies. In order to enhance practical learning as part of the programme, students are taken for educational tours to organizations of national repute such as BSE, NSE, NSDL and RBI Monetary Museum. Field trips to various companies located in the industrial estates in Goa, workshops, seminars and organizing the annual event 'Passonic' also serves as a learning experience for the students. In order to provide students with a hands on job experience students are required to undergo 30 days or 4 weeks of mandatory summer internship in the field of Finance, Accounting or Management.

A large number of periodicals, Journals and books in the library as well as the Department's Book Bank facility caters to the needs of the students and provides them with a knowledge base that the course demands.

The intake capacity of the programme is limited to 40 seats.

2. There is no specific stream requirement for admission to the B. Com. Programme. However, a candidate who has completed XII Commerce will get preference over candidates from other streams.
3. Students seeking admission for the B.Com. Programme in Rosary College has to login to the DHE Admission Portal, pay the registration fees online and then select Rosary College along with the subjects he or she intends to study.
4. Students with high percentages will get the subjects of their choice on a first come first serve basis. Others will be offered subjects based on availability.
5. Subject counseling to the students will be provided by the faculty over the telephone or personally in college during the time of admission.
6. Candidates who have passed out from other Boards of Examinations except the Goa Board have to obtain an eligibility certificate from the Goa University.

BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A.)

1. Students seeking admission to the BA Programme are required to have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (HSSCE) of Class XII conducted by the Goa Board or an examination or Board recognized as equivalent thereto.
2. There is no specific stream requirement for admission to the BA Programme. However, a candidate who has completed XII Arts will get preference over candidates from other streams.
3. Students seeking admission for the BA Programme in Rosary College has to login to the DHE Admission Portal, pay the registration fees online and then select Rosary College along with the subjects he or she intends to study.
4. Students with high percentages will get the subjects of their choice on a first come first serve basis. Others will be offered subjects based on availability.
5. Subject counseling to the students will be provided by the faculty over the telephone or personally in college during the time of admission.
6. Candidates who have passed out from other Boards of Examinations except the Goa Board have to obtain an eligibility certificate from the Goa University.

BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (BCA)

1. Students seeking admission to the BCA Programme are required to have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (HSSCE) of Class XII in any stream, conducted by the Goa Board or an examination or Board recognized as equivalent thereto.
2. The admission for BCA programme is based on the performance of the student at the XII Standard Board Examination.
3. Students seeking admission for the BCA Programme in Rosary College has to login to the DHE SAMARTH Admission Portal and then select Rosary College as the preferred College.
4. Students interested in enrolling for the BCA Course have to compulsorily answer an Entrance Exam conducted by the College / Goa University.
5. A merit list will be prepared based on the percentage of marks scored by the students at the entrance exam.
6. Students whose names appear in the merit list have to login to the college admission portal for completing the final admission procedure including payment of fees within the due date.

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA)

1. Students seeking admission to the BBA Programme (General) are required to have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (HSSCE) of Class XII in any stream, conducted by the Goa Board, or a Board recognized as equivalent thereto with the minimum aggregate marks of 50%.
2. Students wishing to enroll for the BBA Course (General) have to compulsorily answer an Entrance Exam (RCAT) conducted by the college or Goa University and a personal interview.
3. Students seeking admission for the BBA Programme in Rosary College has to login to the DHE SAMARTH Admission Portal and then select Rosary College as the preferred college.
4. Students will be shortlisted based on the aggregate of marks obtained at the Board Exams along with the marks scored at the Entrance Exams and personal interview.
5. The marks obtained by the students at the XII Standard Board Exams will be converted into 50% weightage while the performance of the student for the entrance exam will be converted into 30% weightage and the personal interview will have a weightage of 20%. A merit list will be prepared by adding all the three scores obtained by the students.
6. The dates for the personal interview will be announced later.
7. Students whose names appear in the merit list have to login to the college admission portal for completing the final admission procedure including payment of fees within the due date.
8. NRI Quota – The College offers Two Super Numerary Seats for NRI's in the BBA (General) Programme for the Academic Year 2024-25, with the permission of the Goa University. Such students have to pay double the tuition fees each year.

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA- TRAVEL & TOURISM)

1. Students seeking admission to the BBA (T&T) Programme are required to have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (HSSCE) of Class XII in any stream, conducted by the Goa Board, or a Board recognized as equivalent thereto with the minimum aggregate marks of 50%.
2. Students wishing to enroll for the BBA (T&T) Course have to compulsorily answer an Entrance Exam (RCAT) conducted by the college or Goa University and a personal interview.
3. Students seeking admission for the BBA (T&T) Programme in Rosary College has to login to the DHE SAMARTH Admission Portal and then select Rosary College as the preferred college.
4. Students will be shortlisted based on the aggregate of marks obtained at the Board Exams along with the marks scored at the Entrance Exams and personal interview.
5. MASTER OF COMMERCE (M. COM)

2. Students have to compulsorily answer the Goa University Admission Ranking Test (GU-ART) conducted by the Goa University and admission to the M.com. programme at Goa University and its affiliated colleges shall be based only on the GU-ART Rank obtained by the candidates.
3. Seats for the M.com. Programme shall be allotted through Physical Counselling which will be held at the Goa University.
4. Seats shall be allotted in the order of Rank at the GU-ART exam.
5. Students who are offered seats at Goa University or its affiliated college shall have to pay Rs.

5,000/- as seat confirmation fees through the Goa University Management Systems (GUMS) Portal through online mode only.

6. To complete the final admission procedure, students have to visit the college website.

FACILITIES AND SUPPORT SERVICES

INFRASTRUCTURE

CAMPUS: The College is located at a distance of about 2.5 kilometers from the commercial capital of Goa, Margao, and is placed amid lush surroundings that stimulate learning. This environment charges students with a new energy. The resources provided to the students include spacious classrooms each equipped with LCD projectors, interactive panels, excellent computer laboratories with the latest software, a well-stocked library, and a cafeteria, among others. The entire campus is connected with a state-of-the-art LAN connection, Wi-Fi networks, and computer servers. The campus is a blend of modernity and the latest advances in technology.

HEALTH CARE: Free eye check-up camps, diabetes camps, first-aid courses, Yoga sessions, vaccination programmes and talks on health and nutrition are periodically organized by the College. A prominent general practitioner renders his services to the College in case of medical emergencies. Another step in health care is the provision for a well-stocked infirmary and clean washrooms.

WI-FI ENABLED CAMPUS: The Wi-Fi networks in the college provide internet connectivity within the computer laboratories and all throughout the campus.

LIBRARY: The Library with its modern infrastructure, resources and pleasant environment strives to provide best service to its patrons. It has a large collection of books and is fully automated with the NewGenLib Library Management Software AND KOHA. The library also holds an interesting collection of periodicals, national and international journals as well as e-resources such as e-journals and e-books. Computers in the library have internet connectivity and provide instant access to information from web and e-resources such as sage e-journals via LAN. For the benefit of student's library also provides printing and photo copying facility besides

giving the students access to kindles and tabs which can be used for studying as well as accessing general reading materials. The library is also member of various networks like DELNET, NLIST and NDLI and provides CAS and virtual library service to its users. The library also uses Drillbit plagiarism detection software to scan research papers and to maintain high quality in research papers and projects of faculty and students.

CAFETERIA: The campus houses a spacious cafeteria that caters to the varied tastes of the student community.

LABORATORIES: The College has well-equipped laboratories that house over 300 computer systems. The systems are connected by a LAN. High-end IBM servers provide essential services across the network of computers and run various applications. A sophisticated firewall ensures that students have access to information on the internet that is relevant to their academics.

SPORTS FACILITIES: The campus has a modern gymnasium equipped with the latest exercise machinery. There are facilities for indoor games such as Table-Tennis, Judo, Taekwondo, Chess and Carom. The gymnasium also has a weight-training room. Yoga sessions are conducted in the gymnasium by qualified Yoga instructors from time to time. The Rosary Educational Complex includes a stadium and a playground for outdoor activities. Cycling training kits and bicycles are provided to students for training as well as participating in cycling events.

MULTIMEDIA CENTRE: A state-of-the-art multimedia centre is available for the screening of movies, making of documentaries and editing of short films.

SUPPORT SERVICES

COACHING FOR COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS: Students are guided to answer state and national level competitive examinations like IAS, UPSC, GPSC, IRDA - Insurance Advisors, CPT(For Chartered Accountancy), NET, SET and GU-ART.

COUNSELLING: The process of growing up and making a transition into the world of responsibilities is wrought with issues such as a lack of self-esteem, insecurity and peer-pressure. Counselling facilities are offered to the students to help them deal with such issues.

REMEDIAL TEACHING: Remedial teaching is provided for those students who are academically challenged. All efforts are made to ensure that no student lags behind in his or her studies.

VALUE EDUCATION: To be grounded and not to lose oneself to the demands of the materialistic world, Value Education sessions are conducted once a week for the students of all programmes

by competent external faculty which comprises of religious persons and social workers. The syllabus delves into issues like family relationships, social problems, environmental concerns and personality development.

MENTORSHIP: Each class is allocated a class teacher and a mentor. These mentors closely monitor the attendance, academic performance and behaviour of each student. The class teacher/mentor also periodically interacts with parents, keeping them updated about their ward's performance.

RMI HOSTEL FACILITIES: The RMI nuns (Religious of Mary Immaculate) provide hostel facilities to girl students who are enrolled in Rosary College and who require these facilities. Simple, safe accommodation and food is provided in this hostel where girls are also trained to live in a family-like atmosphere of care and concern while simultaneously nurturing healthy relationships.

AICUF (ALL INDIA CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY FEDERATION): Members of the AICUF organize a number of religious / spiritual programmes and students are encouraged to participate in these programmes. These programmes provide the students with an opportunity for interaction with volunteers and with those persons working full-time at AIDS centers, prisons and hospitals. These activities are conducted with an objective of faith formation and with a goal of inculcating in students a genuine concern for the marginalized and oppressed sections of society, so they effectively commit themselves to the task of building a new and just society.

NET GENIUS - NET GENIUS is a State level networking Quiz organized by the BCA Department in association with Bilsoft Academy. The event provides an opportunity for all Computer Science students to compete for the NetGenius Championship.

S-CAPADE - S-CAPADE is a National Level Annual Exhibition of software products created by the students of the BCA Department

SPORTS - In keeping with the motto of holistic development of the students, sports activities are given due importance in the College. The students have consistently been performing well in the inter-collegiate sporting events organized by Goa University. The students of the College have brought home the title of 'Best College in Sports' at the Goa University for six academic years over the last decade in 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2013-14, 2016-17 and 2019-20.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES - CULTURAL ACTIVITIES held during the academic year are windows for students' to display their talents and creativity. Events like the Singing Competition, Folk Dance Competition, Social Advertisement Competition, Fun Week, Bazaar Day, Carol Singing and Live Crib Competition as well as Founders' Day, besides being an explosion of fun, provide students with a platform to explore their creative faculties.

STATE, NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL SEMINARS, WORKSHOPS, CONFERENCES - Seminars, workshops and conferences are conducted to keep the faculty and the students abreast of the latest developments in various fields. These events address a wide variety of topics and issues which update the staff and students about current as well as subject related matters. These programmes are chaired by people who have achieved great heights in their chosen profession or interest. The seminars and workshops also bring together the student community and the corporate world with a common goal of enhancing knowledge.

CELLS, CLUBS AND COMMITTEES

The College has several specialized cells, clubs and committees that conduct various programmes for the students. These are as follows:

STUDENTS' COUNCIL: The Students' Council is a student-based group that renders support for conducting the various co-curricular activities that take place throughout the academic year. RULES: ANTI RAGGING POLICY

RAGGING:

Ragging is a punishable offence. As per the Supreme Court Order ragging is strictly prohibited on the Campus. Any case of ragging should be brought to the notice of the authorities. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to disciplinary action including rustication from the College and even criminal prosecution under relevant laws. Ragging within or outside the educational Institution is prohibited. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or instigates ragging within or outside the educational Institution shall be suspended, expelled or rusticated from the Institution. 'Ragging' is banned in the College and any one found indulging in it will be punished appropriately, which may include expulsion from the College.

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or student which causes or is likely to cause annoyance/hardship/physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- Asking any student indulge in any act, which the said student will not in ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or torment or embarrassment, so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts, or disturbs the regular academic activity of any student or a fresher.
- Exploiting the service of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- Any act of physical abuse including all the variants of it; sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.

- Any act or abuse by spoken words, e-mails, post, public insults, etc., which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- Any act that affects the mental health and self confidence of a fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Action to be taken by the Head of the Institution

On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of Institution shall immediately determine if a case under the Penal Law is made out and if so; either on his/her own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging authorized by him or her in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR) within 24 hours on receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate Penal Provisions relating to one or more below mentioned acts:

- Abetment to Ragging
- Criminal conspiracy to ragging
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging
- Public nuisance created during ragging
- Violation of decency and morals through ragging
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt
- Wrongful restraint
- Wrongful confinement
- Use of criminal force
- Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offence
- Extortion
- Criminal trespass
- Offences against property
- Criminal intimidation
- Threat to commit any of the above mentioned offences
- Physical or psychological humiliation
- Any other offences following from the designation of “Ragging”.

Provided that the Head of the Institution shall forthwith report the occurrence of the incident of ragging to the District level ARC to the office of the affiliating University.

Institution shall also continue with its enquiry initiated under clause (9) of these regulations and other measures without waiting for action on the part of police/local authorities and such remedial action shall be initiated and completed immediately and in no case later than a period of 7 days of the reported occurrence of the incident of Ragging.

Administrative action in the event of ragging

Sub Clause: 1. The Institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in under:

- a) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to the punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- b) The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, or award to those found guilty one or more of the following punishment namely:
 - Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
 - Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
 - Withholding results.
 - Debarring from representing the Institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
 - Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
 - Cancellation of admission.
 - Expulsion from the Institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other Institution for a specific period.
 - Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the Institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- c) An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie.
 - In case of an order of an Institution affiliated to or constituent part, of a university to the Vice Chancellor of the University.
 - In case of an order of a University to its Chancellor.
 - In case of an Institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament to the Chairman or Chancellor of the Institution as the case may be.
